

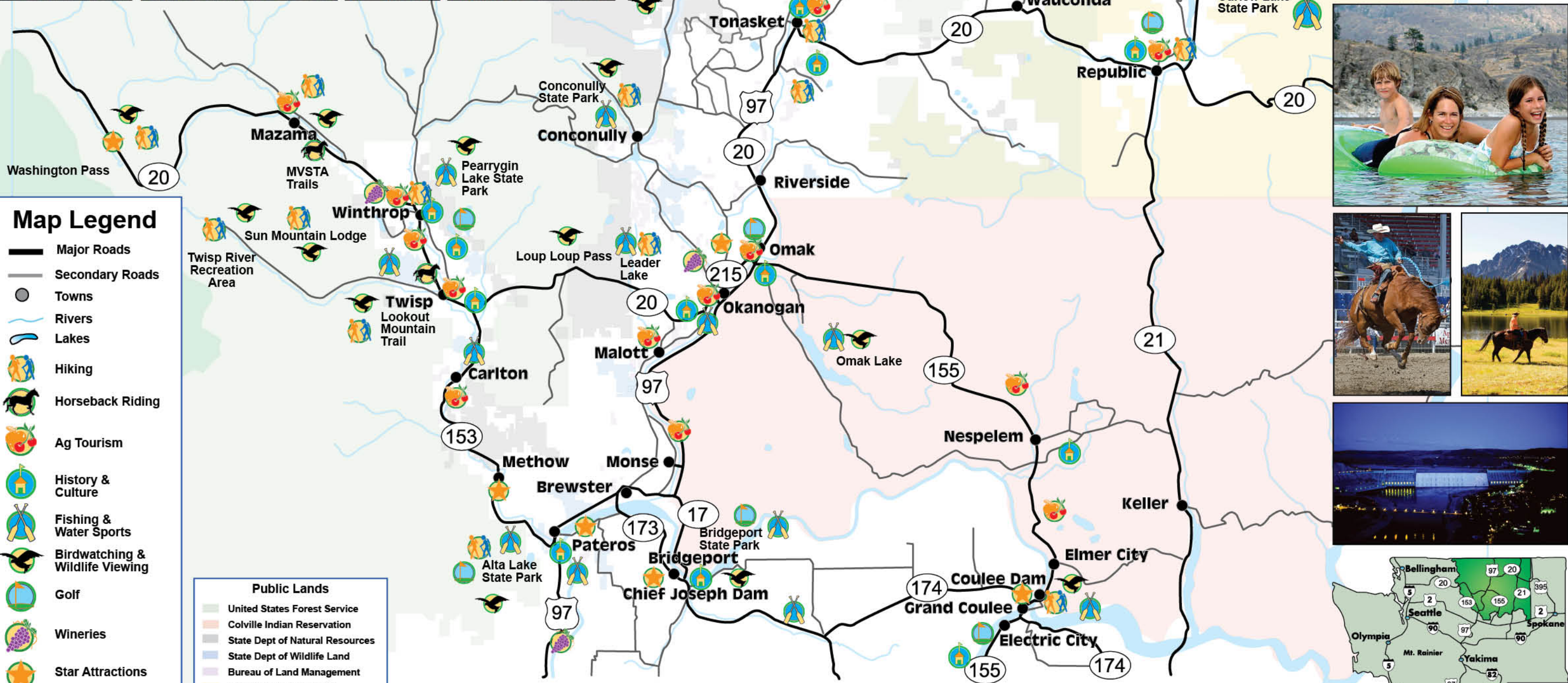

State Parks: (888) 226-7688

Alta Lake State Park • Pateros • 3 miles north of Pateros, this state park has boat launch, camping, and nearby golf course.

Bridgeport State Park • On Rufus Woods Lake behind Chief Joseph Dam; boat launch, fishing, camping, golf course nearby, swimming.

Conconully State Park • Boat ramps, fishing, horseshoe pits, mountain biking, wildlife viewing.

Curlew Lake State Park • North of Republic • Camping, water sport activities, natural history and archeological study.

Lake Osoyoos Veteran's Memorial Park • City of Oroville facilities includes 2 boat launches, fishing access, campground and rv spaces. (509) 476-3321

Pearrygin Lake State Park • Winthrop • Boating, fishing, camping, swimming, watersports. Rentals nearby.

Lake Roosevelt National Recreation Area • 27 public campgrounds • (509) 754-7800

Steamboat Rock State Park • South Grand Coulee Dam • **On Banks Lake**, offers water recreation, biking, camping, hiking, wildlife watching. Golf course and other activities nearby.

Fishing, Boating & Water Sports

Alta Lake • N of Pateros. State park, public access, fishing, swimming, boating, water recreation.

Banks Lake • Human made reservoir near Coulee City is good for stand up paddle boards.

Bonaparte Lake • 18 mi NE of Tonasket. Resort, fishing pier at USFS campground.

Palmer Lake • 4.5 mi N of Loomis. Fishing, campgrounds, restrooms, boat launch. Disability access.

Pearrygin Lake • N of Winthrop. State park, public & disability access. Swimming, fishing, boat launch and restrooms.

Rufus Woods Lake • 51 miles long above Chief Joseph Dam; wildlife viewing and bird watching, boating, fishing, waterskiing & windsurfing.

Spectacle Lake • About 12 mi NW of Tonasket. Three resorts, fishing, public access with restroom facilities and launch.

Wannacut Lake • Near Oroville. Fishing, resort and public access with restrooms and launch.

Whitestone Lake • N of Tonasket. Good access with launch, restrooms. Camping. Disability access.

Alta Lake • N of Pateros. State park, public access, fishing, swimming, boating, water recreation.

Banks Lake • Human made reservoir near Coulee City is good for stand up paddle boards.

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Trails & Wildlife Viewing

Candy Point Trail • Coulee Dam Difficult, steep, 2 mi round trip.

Park at Coulee Dam Federal Credit Union, walk 300 ft down to trail.

Foster-Tawlks Suspension Bridge • Mazama • 1.5 mi round trip w/ suspension bridge.

Golden Tiger Pathway • Republic 2.5 mi easy walking/biking railtrail, gravel surface from town (starts behind Chevron)

Historic Pateros Walking Trail • Approx ½ mi easy walk thru park, alongside river in downtown, splash park for kids.

Lookout Mountain Trail • Twisp 3 mi round trip, hard, steep hike.

McLaughlin Canyon • S. of Tonasket flat easy 3 mi round trip. Rock climbing, wildlife & history.

Methow Community Trail • From Winthrop Fish Hatchery along Methow River. From 1-40 mi, connects w/ other trails as far as Sun Mountain.

Rufus Wood Downriver Trail • 6.5 mi hike/jog/bike trail by Columbia

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River below Grand Coulee Dam. All ages, 6.5 miles

Similkameen Trail • 7 mi round trip from Oroville VIC. Railtrail; ideal for hiking, biking, birding, wildlife & history.

Sinlahekin Wildlife Area • 4.5 miles NE of Conconully, 14,000 acres. Wildlife viewing, bird watching.

Twisp Ponds Discovery Walk • Easy river walk (1½ to 2 miles) Interpretive ecological signage, on the Twisp River Road

Sun Mountain Lodge Trails • 40+ miles of trails - incredible diversity and beauty.

Whistler Canyon • On HWY 97, 14 mi N of Tonasket, 3 mi S of Oroville. Short day hikes to extended hikes, horseback riding and rock climbing opportunities.

Winthrop Bridges Walk • Spring Creek Bridge & Sa Teekh Wa Bridge & Trail • From either end of town, enjoy 1.5 mi scenic walk and two pedestrian bridges.
